We can change some adjectives into nouns by adding a suffix.

What is a suffix?



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What is a suffix?

A suffix is a group of letters that we can add to the end of words to change their meaning.

-est greatest



We are a new suffix today - ness



When you add -ness onto the end of a word it changes from an adjective to a noun.

To change the adjectives into nouns we can add the suffix...

-ness

A noun ending in 'ness' means the state of being. For example *Tiredness* is the state of being *tired*.



Tommy's <u>tiredness</u> was caused by his very late bedtime last night.

Spelling rules for adding —ness.

Most of the time adding —ness is simple!

Spelling rules for adding —ness.

Sometimes adding —ness can be trickier!

When the adjectives end in a 'y', we usually change the 'y' to an 'i' and then add -ness.


