E-Safety Progression	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> I can identify some technology in school and at home and begin to talk about its purpose. I can talk about what I am doing on a computer. I know why it is important to be kind and polite to other people and know I can speak to an adult if someone is unkind to me. I know what the internet is and understand that websites can be used to find out information. I know to tell an adult if I see something that makes me feel worried, scared or sad. I can talk about the games and activities I like to use on computers and other devices, e.g. tablets, phones. 			<ul style="list-style-type: none"> I know what is meant by 'technology' and can identify a variety of examples in and out of school. I can identify objects that use modern technology and those that do not, e.g. <i>a microwave vs. a chair</i>. I know it is important to be kind and polite, including when online, and know what I should do if someone is unkind to me. I know that not everyone is who they say they are on the internet. I can give some examples of basic personal information (e.g. name, age) and understand that I should not share this online. I can talk about some of the ways to keep safe online. I know to tell an adult when I see something unexpected or worrying online. I know and understand why we have to log-in to use a computer and why I should keep my password safe. I know the internet can give me information about a given topic, and can use it for this purpose as part of a class or supervised group.. 		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> I can explain what is meant by 'technology' and can identify a variety of examples in and out of school. I can talk about why it is important to be kind and polite, including when online and know what I should do if someone is unkind to me. I know that some devices can connect users with other people, e.g. phones, internet, Xbox etc., and know that things can be shared electronically. I know it is important to have separate log-ins / passwords to shared computers and can explain why to another person. I know that not everyone is who they say they are on the internet. <i>(Revisit from Y1)</i> I know what personal information is and can explain why I should not share this online. I can agree and follow sensible e-safety rules. I know to tell an adult when I see something unexpected or worrying online. <i>(Revisit from Y1)</i> I can use the internet safely to search for information linked to a given topic, under the supervision of a teacher. I know what a digital footprint is and give some examples.
