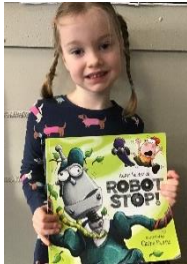




Reading Newsletter – Autumn 2022

This is my favourite book because "the worm saves the animals"



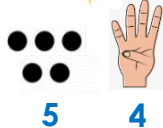
"I like this book because it is called Sky the Blue Fairy and my favourite colour is blue!"

Words of the Term!

Reception:

subitise – recognise the number of objects in a small group without the need to count them.

We have been learning to **subitise** numbers up to 5.



Year 1:

classify – grouping

We have been **classifying** animals depending on their diet (herbivore, carnivore, omnivore).

Year 2:

significant – very important

We have been learning about **significant** people in history.
